South Cotswold Youth Orchestra

The South Cotswold Youth Orchestra gives young musicians across the South Gloucestershire and Bristol areas access to music-making at the highest level. Directed by Dury Loveridge, Chris Sanders and Sarah Eales, this ensemble of elite musicians, grade 5 upwards, study and perform larger-scale symphonic works, presenting a termly concert.

Previous performances have included Malcolm Arnold's Little Suite No.1, Elgar's Pomp and Circumstance and works by Grieg, Bizet and Walton, alongside opportunities for players to perform solo works with the orchestra, or to have their compositions workshopped.

The SCYO meets over a 3-week period ending in a performance each term. There are no entrance auditions, but players may be asked to play to tutors to help with seating. The fee for each course is £30. Dates are available on the website.

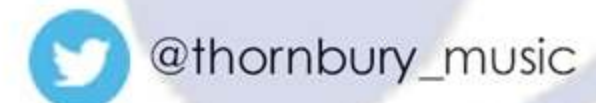

The Thornbury Area Music Trust is a charitable music trust (Registered Charity Number 1150923) set up by parents and volunteers in Thornbury, South Gloucestershire.

The aim of the trust is to maintain and enhance collective youth music making in the South Gloucestershire and North Bristol area, and to promote excellence in music.

The trust comprises 3 complimentary activities catering for all ages and abilities.

Thornbury Area Junior Music Centre

Thornbury Area Junior Music Centre (TAJMC) meets at Marlwood School in Alveston, South Gloucestershire on a Saturday morning at the same time as the main music centre (TAMC)

There are 3 separate sessions:

Foundation Class : For reception aged children and involves singing, playing and exploring percussion instruments

Music Makers Class : For years 1 and 2 and follows on from the foundation class with the children developing their skills in singing, sound exploration, listening responses and performance skills with an emphasis on playing tuned percussion instruments.

Recorder class : For years 2 and 3 - this class provides an opportunity for the children to receive tuition on the recorder and to continue to develop their musical skills in other ways like singing and basic composition.

The sessions last 45 minutes and the term will cover 9 weeks.

The cost of these 9 weeks is £27.00 – although we are able to offer bursaries for those on income support whose children would be interested in joining.

 Activities for all ages and abilities on all orchestral instruments, beginners to grade 8

With over 100 musicians attending, TAMC is the trust's primary activity. There are 2 orchestras, 2 string ensembles, 2 wind bands, chamber music, a choir, theory and musicianship classes taking place in a fun and friendly atmosphere.

Groups perform in public concerts each term and there is a bi-annual tour, which in 2014 will be to Paris.

A typical morning at TAMC:

- 9.30-10.15 - Junior Strings, Junior Wind, Senior Wind, Senior Strings
- 10.15-10.40 - Break and tuckshop
- 10.40-11.10 - Choir, Chamber Music Ensembles, Music Theory & Musicianship
- 11.10-12.00 - Junior Orchestra, Senior Orchestra

All staff work both as professional musicians and instrumental teachers. Between them they have experiences of everything from playing with bands at Glastonbury to performing for the BBC. They are well-qualified and have been directing music ensembles and inspiring young musicians for many years.

There are no auditions to join the groups at TAMC, although a group director may ask to hear you play if they think you should move up to a more demanding group. You do not need to bring anything other than your instrument (and maybe some money for the tuck shop).

TAMC meets for 10 sessions each term, with a public concert. The fee for attending is £45 per term, and £40 for each additional sibling. There are a small number of bursaries for those on income support.

If you want to find out more, why not bring along your instrument to TAMC and try it with no obligation to pay until you choose to continue.
